

What is "Pagan"?



- "Earth Based Religions"
- Generally European in origin.
 - Not Eastern religions (Buddhism, Hindu, Shinto)
 - Not Native religions (Native American)

Pagan religions have similarities with and have borrowed from many of these religions...



Pagan Beliefs



- The specifics of Pagan belief systems vary wildly.
- Paths and Traditions
 - Every individual has a Path
 - Some Paths become Traditions by being passed on.
- Most Paths borrow heavily from one or more Traditions.
- Most Traditions don't have formal, organizational structures.




Pagan Beliefs



- Some General statements:
- Nature is important
 - Individual relationship / place in the world is significant.
- Self-development is required.
 - Questioning and research are encouraged.
- Community is important.
- Pagan belief systems can be Polytheist, Pantheist, Animist, Agnostic, or Atheist.
- May believe in an afterlife, but it's less important.
- Often believe in intercessory or non-intercessory miracles ("Magic")



Wheel of the Year



- Most common calendar of Pagan holidays.
- Some Pagans, and many Heathens, celebrate on different calendars.
- This version is for the Northern Hemisphere; the dates switch south of the equator.



Pagan Beliefs

- Do not believe in Original Sin.
 - The world isn't sinful, it's beautiful.
 - Disconnection is what causes problems.
 - Don't need to "save" people.
- Do not believe others need to convert.
 - Those who belong will find it.
 - Teach anyone, recruit no one.
 - Generational learning.
 - The "Call."
- Do not see the world through dualistic good vs evil.
- Little, no, or negative emphasis on "Faith."



How NOT to Provide Support

- Understand the cross on your chest works against you.
- If you don't know about the individual's personal Path, don't assume.
- Most Pagans have learned to be intensely private about their religion.
- They're unlikely to be asking you about religion they need something else.
- If you do talk about beliefs some Pagans will take it as proselytizing and disengage.
 - "Can I pray for you?" is a loaded question.



How Provide Support

- Stay secular.
- Be a friend.
- Listen.
- Let them lead.
- Ask for help.

You have one chance to convince this Soldier that you're there to help them, not judge them.
